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What is the Sports Premium?

The government is providing additional funding to improve provision of physical education and sport in primary schools. Schools receive PE and sport premium funding based on the number of pupils in years 1 to 6. This funding - provided jointly by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport - will be allocated to primary school Headteachers and is ring-fenced and therefore can only be spent on provision of PE and sport in schools.

What is the purpose of the funding?

In the Academic Year 2024-2025 Manor School received £17,730. The PE and Sport Premium grant was used to enhance current provision of PE equipment and enrichment experiences to support our pupils to access a wider variety of sports activities to improve mental health and introduce our pupils to new skills and interests to improve their overall fitness. We supported staff to develop skills to ensure all opportunities to take part in sports and fitness are maximised at every opportunity throughout the school day.

<p><u>Top up swimming lessons</u></p> <p>Spending has been targeted on providing leisure centre based top up swim lessons for Year 6 pupils who have outgrown our school based swimming pool.</p>	£3203.25	<p>By attending off site swimming lessons at Moberly Sports Centre the Year 6 pupils have had the opportunity to experience using their swimming skills in a “real life” scenario. <u>CPD – Upskilling staff for Swimming</u>	£699	Swim England Level 2 teachers course completed by member of staff working within the pool area to upskill the standard of swimming teaching and delivery.	To continue to offer a variety of CPD for a range of staff.
<u>CPD – co-teaching and support</u>	£7700	Throughout the year classes have been offered termly blocks of yoga sessions. Delivered by an external qualified yoga teacher. This is delivered alongside the class room staff who are then able to bring the skills back into the classroom and include yoga within the pupils weekly timetables. <u>Internal – Equipment and Resources</u>	£4075.86	A wide range of PE equipment has been ordered in order to increase the curriculum and extra-curricular opportunities. This includes adapted PE equipment such as textured beams and markers to enhance accessibility for our SEND pupils. It also includes bike and trikes which have contributed towards encouraging active travel as part of our work with TfL stars.
